Article of Interest Contractor Agrees to Pay \$19.6 Million in Fraud Case

A subsidiary of one of the nation's largest construction companies will pay \$19.6 million to settle criminal allegations that it committed fraud against government programs on more than a decade's worth of public works projects, including the \$1.4 billion [Fulton Street Transit Center](#), according to court papers unsealed on Thursday. The company, Skanska USA Civil Northeast Inc., said in a statement that it admitted no wrongdoing and cooperated with the investigation that led to a non prosecution agreement that it signed with the United States attorney in Manhattan, [Preet Bharara](#). The agreement, announced on Thursday, will allow the company to resolve the criminal inquiry without facing charges, which could have made it difficult for Skanska and its parent, Skanska USA Civil Inc., ranked among the nation's top 10 contractors, to win public contracts. Skanska USA Civil Northeast is currently the low bidder, at \$300 million, on a pending contract for a section of the Second Avenue subway project; the contract goes before the [Metropolitan Transportation Authority](#) board this month. Skanska figures prominently in a related indictment unsealed on Thursday charging the owners of a subcontractor, Environmental Energy Associates, with mail and wire fraud conspiracy and with mail fraud. The federal indictment accuses the owners, Balu Kamat, 75, and Carmine Desio, 76, of serving as fronts to help general contractors, including Skanska USA Civil Northeast, evade government contract requirements that they hire a certain percentage of minority- or women-owned contractors or those certified by government agencies as disadvantaged. While Skanska and other companies paid the subcontractor tens of millions of dollars, Environmental Energy Associates had no employees or equipment and did no work, according to the indictment, which said the subcontractor was hired to do concrete work, demolition, air testing, soil sampling and hazardous-gas monitoring. The actual work was performed either by the general contractor or third-party companies. Skanska was the general contractor on 10 projects, including the transit hub, and six other Metropolitan Transportation Authority projects for which the indictment said it hired Environmental Energy Associates to evade the minority requirements. The indictment referred to Skanska as "Contractor No. 1," but the company was named in the non prosecution agreement. Law enforcement and construction industry officials say such schemes are widespread on public works projects. Indeed, another large construction company, Schiavone Construction Company L.L.C., admitted late last year that it had defrauded government programs over the course of five years on \$691 million worth of public projects.

Mr. Kamat and Mr. Desio pleaded not guilty Thursday afternoon during their appearance in Federal District Court in Manhattan before Magistrate Judge Henry B. Pitman and were released on \$500,000 personal recognizance bonds. Before the arraignment, Michael Rosen, a lawyer for Mr. Kamat, said of his client and Mr. Desio, "These guys have been hardworking get-into-the-trench kind of guys for years and years." James R. Froccaro said Mr. Desio "expects to be vindicated at trial." The Skanska investigation was conducted by the inspectors general from the Metropolitan Transportation Authority, the [Port Authority of New York and New Jersey](#), the federal Transportation Department's Office of Inspector General and the federal Labor Department's Office of Labor Racketeering and Fraud Investigation.

The agreement with Skanska requires it to pay \$9.8 million to the United States attorney's office and \$9.8 million to the Metropolitan Transportation Authority, which hired Skanska eight projects cited in the indictment. The company also agreed to cooperate with the investigation and undertake a comprehensive review of its existing minority- and women-owned business subcontracts to ensure that they are in compliance with applicable rules and regulations. The transportation authority's inspector general, Barry L. Kluger, said in a statement that he and the agency's chairman, [Jay H. Walder](#), had discussions on how to best use the money "to combat construction fraud, and create and maintain a level playing field in which all qualified minority- and women-owned businesses have a fair and equal opportunity to bid for, receive and participate in all M.T.A. projects." Richard Cavallaro, president of Skanska USA Civil Inc., said in the statement that the company recognized and regretted that it did not follow best practices "on certain projects" and that it had put in place a compliance officer dedicated to the oversight of the requirements for minority-, women-owned and disadvantaged business enterprises. "We've learned a tough lesson, and we urge others in the industry to learn from it," he said. If convicted, Mr. Kamat and Mr. Desio face a maximum of 40 years in prison.

The law also states that in determining what constitutes a small business, the definition will vary from industry to industry to reflect industry differences accurately. SBA's Small Business Size Regulations implement the Small Business Act's mandate to SBA. SBA has also established a table of size standards, matched to North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) industries.

Nothing is more important than once you have identified a potential bid opportunity is to pursue it aggressively and set-up a contracting infrastructure to:

- Get the plans and specs ASAP
- Request a copy of the plan holder's list
- Attend the pre bid/proposal conference, (request a copy of the sign-in sheet); and market your service (s) with a company profile resume, brochure or business card
- Request copies of the pre bid conference sign-in sheet
- Follow-up on contacts
- Study the plans and specs
- Decide what you're going to bid
- Give the plans and specs to your estimator
- Analyze and understand your estimate
- Read, follow and understand the bid packet instructions and requirements
- Develop an internal bid checklist to verify that all bid documents are included in your bid package, i.e...addendum, amendments, forms, documents, and bid bond
- Have at least two company contract personnel to check and verify that all bid documents, forms, addendum, amendments, bid bond are included in your bid submittal. Check with owner to verify if all addendum or amendments have been received
- Contact potential prime bidders if you're bidding as a sub
- Bid with as many prime bidders as possible
- Follow up with prime bidders to find out whether or not your bid was used; and if not, reason why!
- Utilize information and experience gained to bid future projects

Construction Safety Tips
